MARKITUP TUTORING

MARKITUP owner Nhi Chang understands what it's like to struggle with schoolwork.

Although born in Australia, Ms Chang only spoke Vietnamese when she started school and found it hard to keep up with her classmates.

"Luckily, my parents realised and put me into tutoring early on," Ms Chang explained.

"Without those opportunities, I would not have been able to graduate from the University of NSW with a Bachelor of Commerce."

That realisation prompted her desire to improve on the tutoring experience and customer service in the industry.

"As a result, I chose to start my own tuition centre that inspires, welcomes and, most importantly, cares for the growth and development of individual students by recognising that each child is different and unique," she said.

Ms Chang established MarkitUP Tuition in 2017 at Carnes Hill Community Centre before a need for more

room prompted a move to Len Waters Estate where she could accommodate the more than 200 students who had enrolled.

MarkitUP offers mainly mathematics and English

tuition for kindergarten to Year 12 but they also cover physics, chemistry, biology and business studies in their face-to-face and online lessons.

With 25 tutors on the

books, MarkitUP promises "a truly unique learning program".

"Your child will fall in love with learning all over again," Ms Chang said.

"I have had a number of

parents tell me how after just a few tutoring sessions that their child loves doing their homework.

"It is all about the delivery of the information being taught and when it is being

taught so that you build the child's understanding and confidence. It is actually really easy!"

"That is the magic touch for our primary students."

Ms Chang said when it comes to high school students the tutoring focuses on marks and test results.

"To achieve that, every child here is an individual that is specifically catered for," she said.

"If we feel that a student needs extra time with us to boost their confidence for an exam, they can request additional free lessons."

MarkitUP has taken a proactive response to the current COVID-19 restrictions with students given the option of either online or face-to-face lessons.

"As of early August, we recommended all staff, parents and students wear a mask when entering the premises," Ms Chang said.

"In order to reduce the number of people inside we don't allow parents upstairs and we clean and disinfect all tables and chairs in the room after each student has completed their lesson."
