### What is a Conjunction?

A conjunction is a joining word. It helps put two ideas or sentences together.

### Examples of Conjunctions:

- and – joins similar ideas
- but – shows something different
- because – tells us why
- so – shows a result

### Example Sentences:

- I like apples **and** bananas.
- I want to play, **but** it's raining.
- I wore my coat **because** it was cold.
- I was hungry, **so** I ate lunch.

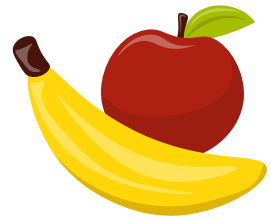
