
☀️ What is an Adverb? ☀️

💡 An adverb is a word that tells us how, when, or where something happens.

Examples:

- She sings loudly. → (How does she sing? Loudly)
- I will go home later. → (When will I go? Later)
- The kids are playing outside. → (Where are they playing? Outside)

🎯 Quick Tip: Adverbs = Add to the verb!


