- Writing an assignment or letter
- Giving a speech or presentation

#### Examples:

- "Good morning, how may I help you?"
- "I am writing to request an extension on my homework."

Informal language is used in casual or friendly conversations.

#### It may include:

- Slang or shortened words
- Contractions (like "I'm", "don't")
- A relaxed tone

#### You'll use it when:

- Talking with friends or family
- Sending a text message
- Chatting at school or home

#### Examples:

- "Hey! Wanna hang out later?"
- "I'm gonna be late, no big deal!"

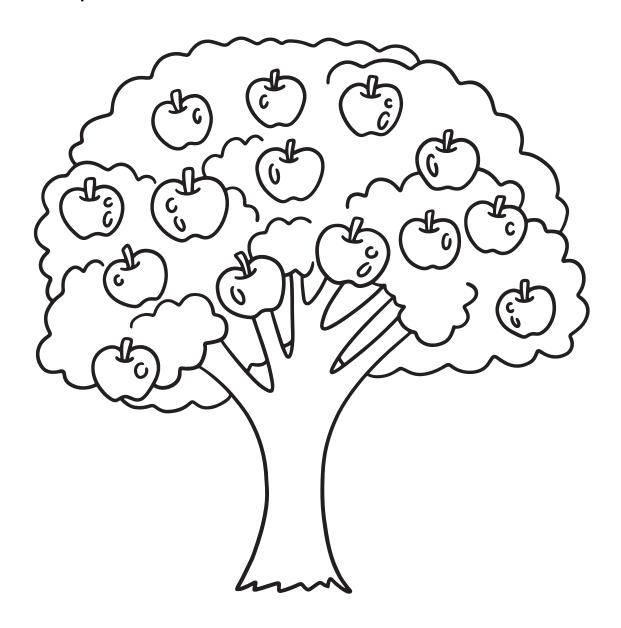
